LARRY'S OLD TIME RADIO BITS

The OTR selections this month deal with the time of year that is so special to most of us – Christmas. Unlike television, where we see many of the same specials repeated yearly, radio did not have that option during the Golden Age of Radio. The recording mediums were not of the quality that is seen today and did not allow for repeating shows from previous years. Therefore, some shows were re-created yearly with new material added to the part of the show that was a favorite of the listening audience. Two shows which followed this formula were the Amos 'n' Andy Christmas Show and the Lum and Abner Christmas Show.

In today's world the Amos 'n' Andy show is not considered politically correct. However, in the 1930's and 1940's it was a wildly popular series. Movie theatre operators would reportedly start a movie at a time that would not interfere with the weekly broadcast. Some theatre owners would even play the show in the theatre so that the movie-going patrons would not miss it. While I am not sure when the first Christmas show was broadcast, I do know that there are many versions of it in my collection with the earliest one from 1941. You can listen to this particular show by following the link below. I sincerely believe that no one will find the show offensive by today's standards, but if anyone does please remember that OTR shows reflect the time in which they were broadcast and are a part of our history.

The Lum and Abner Christmas show was another tradition. The annual production changed somewhat, but the main story line dealing with the birth of a child remained the same year after year. Lum and Abner, along with a cast of characters, resided in Pine Ridge, Arkansas on the fringes of the Ouachita Mountains and remained on the air for over 33 years. The pair operated the Jot 'Em Down Store, which served as the focal point for most episodes. Again, I am not sure when the first Christmas show aired, but the oldest one in my collection is from 1938. You can listen to this show by following the link below.
