LARRY'S OLD TIME RADIO BITS

April is one of my favorite months of the year – spring showers, flowers blooming, and every baseball team is still in contention for the playoffs. With the latter in mind, there are a couple of radio shows that may be enjoyable to those interested in our National Pastime.

The first show is not actually a show, but a skit by Abbot and Costello. The comedy team was successful in vaudeville, radio, movies and television. However, they are known by most people for the skit, "Who's On First." The routine evolved from a vaudeville skit and became the trademark for them. In fact, it actually was issued a trademark by the United States government. The first show that I could find in my collection that contained the skit was Command Performance from April 19th of 1942. Command Performance was a request show for the GI's of WWII. This particular one stars Shirley Temple, several singers, and of course Abbot and Costello. If you feel nostalgic, the whole program is interesting, but if you don't, the "Who's On First" routine is about the seventeen-minute mark. If you just want to hear the skit and are not interested in Old Time Radio, I've also included a version that was released on a record. The quality is much better, but, of course, you will be missing the feel of the radio show. Command Performance is found at this link – Command Performance 420419. And to round out the salute to baseball, here is an episode of X Minus One from April 3^{rd} of 1957. X Minus One was an adult (as opposed to juvenile) science fiction series.
